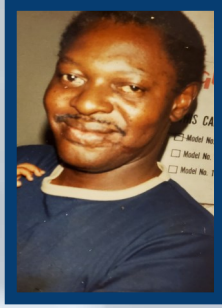

Life Story of Mr. Willie Lee Jones



Mr. Willie Lee Jones, known to many as “Pete Macon” , was the son of the late Mr. Charlie L. Jones and Mrs. Macon (Brown) Jackson, was born on December 31, 1930, in Millen, Georgia. He entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, January 6, 2021.

Willie was enlisted in the U.S. Army from 1953-1955 and was a Korean War Veteran. After his military career, he relocated to the state of New York, where he lived until returning to Georgia, in the early 1990’s.

Mr. Jones was an excellent cook and worked in various establishments, becoming employed in janitorial services in Peekskill, New York.
